# Why looking at links between evaluation and the policy cycle?



REMEMBER M&E INFORMATION IS USEFUL ONLY IF IT IS USED!

- 1) Doing evaluation is not all about data and methods:  
it's also about making that evaluation results are **useful** (e.g., timing) and **used**
- 2) Evaluation is more than the last step of the policy cycle

# Evaluation & the policy cycle: what stakeholders say

*“Through evaluation we can **address several issues in the policy cycle**, such as how a policy has been implemented, who, how and why has it been affected, if savings have been achieved and determine **where it needs to be adapted, continued or ended.**”*

*“**Evaluation should follow the whole policy cycle** and be used in the planning as well as in the controlling (results) of the policy. Systems that incorporate this comprehensive approach seem to be **more successful.**”*

*“During the design of a policy, an evaluation advisor should be present to ensure a good ex-post evaluation (e.g. if the data collection is not well designed it is somewhat very difficult to evaluate the policy or at a large cost - which is somehow the reason for a lack of evaluation), the design should be **‘evaluation-friendly’** .”*

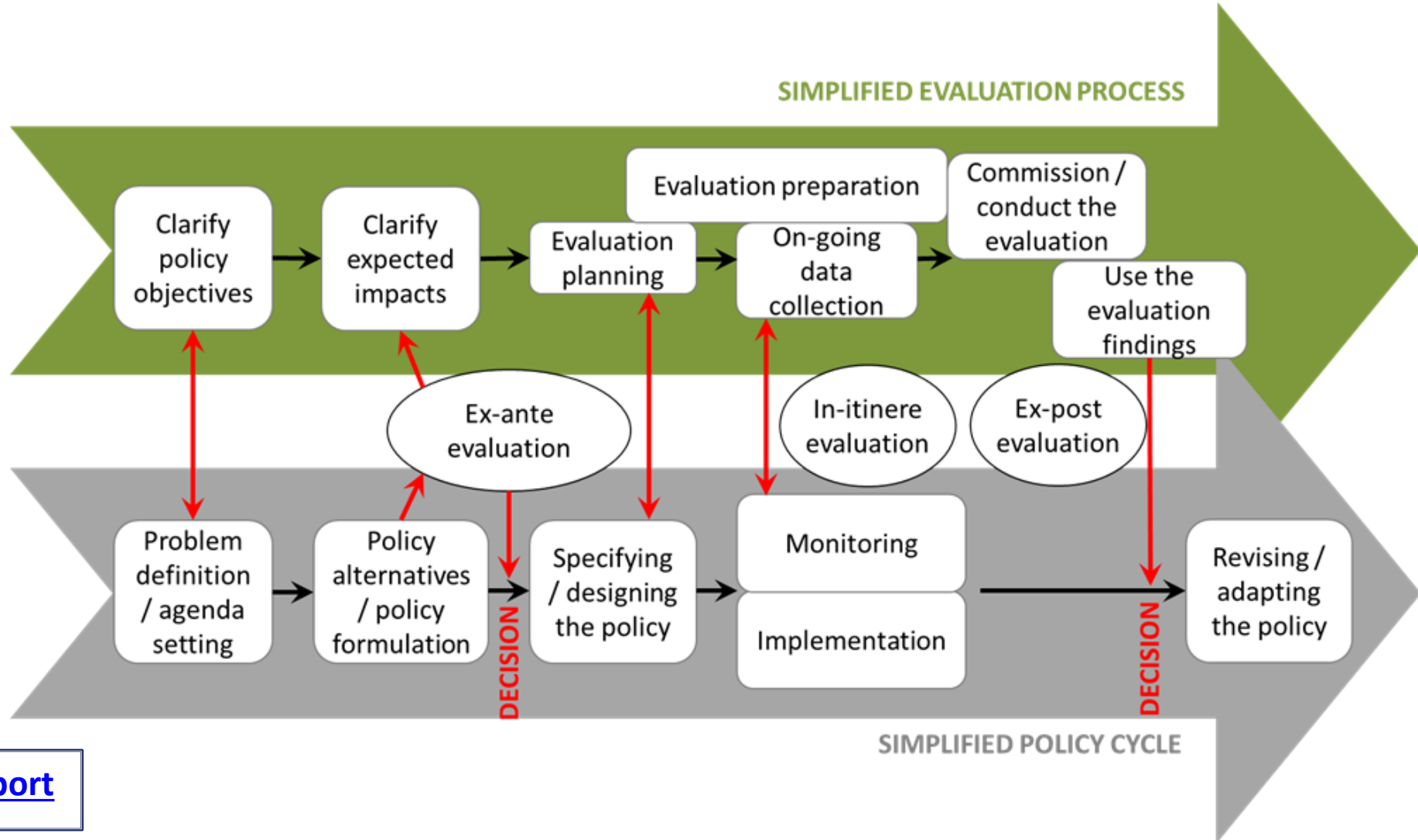
# Evaluation & the policy cycle: A two-way integration

# Integrating evaluation into the policy cycle



[Dedicated report](#)



**Political will** (top-management commitment)

*Examples of barriers:*

Lack of interest, fear of the results, evaluation not always needed, turnover in the policymakers

**Resource allocation** (time, people, budget)

*Examples of barriers:*

Lack of dedicated budget, lack of time to be involved or involve people in the evaluation process

**Evaluation planning and preparation**

*Examples of barriers:*

Difficulties to match timeframe for evaluation and timeframe for decision processes

**Communication and mutual understanding**

*Examples of barriers:*

differences in the cultures or habits between decisional level and operational or technical level

# Examples of good practices

**Political will**  
(top-  
management  
commitment)

- ✓ **Clarify expectations:** what evaluation can bring and how it can be used
- ✓ Analyse **how evaluation can fit in** the current policy framework and processes
- ✓ **Mandatory provisions** for evaluation

**Communication and mutual understanding**

- ✓ **Clarify and discuss the evaluation objectives**  
→ shared understanding → realistic expectations
- ✓ Ensure all key stakeholders are represented in the steering committee + **regular exchanges**

<b>SHORT-TERM ACTIONS</b>	<b>Purpose(s)</b>
<b>Make sure the relevant contacts are identified for each party to be involved</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Ensure an easy communication along the evaluation process</li> </ul>
<b>Clarify the evaluation objectives, and organise a feedback loop (when relevant)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Ensure a shared understanding of the evaluation objectives (and thereby realistic expectations)</li> </ul>
<b>Facilitate exchanges between policymakers, practitioners/implementers and analysts/evaluators</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Maintain regular contacts between the evaluation team and evaluation recipients</li> <li>● Ensure a mutual understanding</li> <li>● Take into account differences in viewpoints</li> <li>● Foster closer collaboration between policymakers &amp; officers and analysts &amp; evaluators)</li> </ul>
<b>MEDIUM-TERM ACTIONS</b>	<b>Purpose(s)</b>
<b>Maintain an updated list of contacts from the different services and bodies involved in the different stages of the policy</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Maintain regular contacts</li> <li>● Facilitate an easy communication</li> <li>● Avoid missing or outdated links in the communication loops</li> </ul>
<b>Facilitate capacity building and experience sharing about evaluation issues (e.g., targeted workshops or trainings; technical briefs; testimonies about past evaluations)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Increase awareness and knowledge about evaluation</li> </ul>



Focus on the implementation of a key part of the EU Energy Efficiency Directive (now Article 8): Member States' energy savings obligation

Stakeholders' survey (Feb. 2023):

top priority need = **evaluating actual impacts**

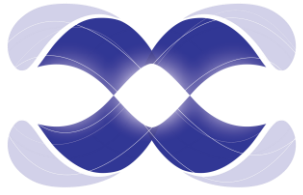
**Parliaments:** may request evaluations + possible place for public debates about evaluation results of major policies

**Court of Auditors:** reviews based on collecting stakeholders' views, but also on available data and studies (including evaluations) + high visibility of their recommendations

**Researchers:** increasing interest in policy evaluation + own initiatives

**NGOs:** may also commission evaluations and/or use evaluations in their advocacy work

→ Stimulate **substantiated debates**, going beyond mere opinions

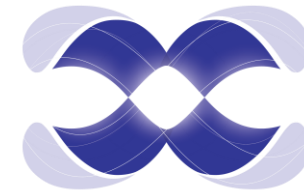
